



Maxim Matiuschenkov (Germany, Munich) - Artistic director and teacher of the School of Choral Art in Munich (Germany), regent of the choir of the Russian Orthodox Church in Munich.

Maxim Matiuschenkov studied conducting and opera singing in Minsk and in Austria (Mozarteum Salzburg University, in the class of Professor Mario Diaz). His students are winners of vocal competitions, as well as participants in numerous international festivals and opera projects of leading theaters in the German-speaking space.



Ludmila Zinchenko (Ukraine, Odessa) - graduate of the Odessa State Conservatory named after A.V. Nezhdanova (class of Professor V.V. Kasyanov). Senior teacher of the highest category. Teacher of the children's music school No. 1 named after Emil Gilels, worked at the Odessa Music School named after K. F. Dankevich. Students participated in international competitions in Poland, the Czech Republic, Slovakia and Ukraine, many of them are winners of the Grand Prix and first prizes. For 15 years Ludmila Zinchenko led the orchestra of folk instruments and the ensemble of domrists, who repeatedly became laureates of various competitions.



Jung Chun Man (South Korea, Seoul) - a graduate of the Central Music School at the Tchaikovsky Moscow State Conservatory (class of Professor Victor Pikaizen), in 2020 she graduated with honors from the Moscow State Tchaikovsky Conservatory in the violin class (class of Professor Irina Bochkova). Winner of many international competitions and festivals. She has toured throughout Russia, performing with orchestras and chamber ensembles of various compositions. Participated in the international festival Bach Festival& Workshop in America.



Nadja Preissler (Germany, Munich) - Director of the music school "Munich Music Seminar". Chairman of the charitable society "Munich Music Seminar". Teacher. A student of Walter Krafft, who combined both German and Romanian pianism in his approach, Nadja Preissler currently runs a music school founded by her teacher, as well as a charitable society Förderverein Münchener Musikseminar e.V. aimed at supporting young talents. Nadezhda Preissler is the founder and owner of the KPCM concert agency, which organizes classical music concerts in the city of Munich and its surroundings, and is active in teaching – her students have repeatedly won places in various competitions.



Sholpan Barlykova (Russia, Moscow) in 1987-1993 studied at the Central Music School of the Moscow State Conservatory named after P. I. Tchaikovsky in the class of L. V. Roshchina. In 1998 she graduated from the Moscow State Tchaikovsky Conservatory and in 2002 completed a postgraduate course in Solo Performance. Winner of the International Bach Piano Competition (Germany, 2007). Sholpan works as a concertmaster at the Moscow State Tchaikovsky Conservatory in the class of A. E. Vinnitsky. Since 2006 she has been a teacher of general piano at the Central Music School.



Julia Bikhovets (Russia, Moscow) - Winner of All-Russian and international competitions, graduate of the Academic Music College at the Tchaikovsky Moscow State Conservatory and the Ippolitov-Ivanov Moscow State Music Institute (class of Honored Artist of the Russian Federation Alexey Volkov). Julia is an active solo artist in Russia and abroad, collaborates with leading orchestras in Russia. She is a fellow of the Mikhail Prokhorov Foundation "Road to Talents" and the Yuri Rozum International Charitable Foundation. Participant of the programs of the St. Petersburg House of Music and the "Directorate of International Programs". Representative of the Russian manufacturer of canes "Fedotov reeds", soloist of the first female saxophone quartet in Russia "Sirenes saxophone quartet". Trained by leading European masters (Claude Delangle, Arno Bornkamp, Christian Wirth, Nobuya Sugawa etc.)



Svetlana Pilchena (Russia, Moscow) - a graduate of the Odessa State Conservatory named after A.V. Nezhdanova, a musician with more than thirty years of experience. Vice-President of the International Music Project Gilels-Kogan, Artistic Director of the Moscow Youth Academic Philharmonic. Currently, Svetlana is the head of the string department of the Alexandrov Moscow Children's Music School, and is a teacher of the violin class. Students of her class are laureates and diploma winners of international and regional competitions, take part in numerous concerts in Russia and abroad.
